

Many of you know that my wife and I go on an annual vacation with two other couples—Jim, who is a retired pastor with his wife Joyce, and Ed, who is still serving as a pastor with his wife Susan. Jim and Ed are both marathon runners (silly, silly boys!) who select a different locale each year that hosts a marathon. We have traveled to the Outer Banks, New

England, South Carolina, Niagara Falls, the twin cities of St. Paul and Minneapolis, Nashville, and this November, we will travel to Madison, Wisconsin. I have become caught up in the world of marathons—without actually being a runner myself (I get tired just driving 26 miles!)

On our first marathon vacation with these couples, we went to the Outer Banks of North Carolina in November of 2019. The day before they ran the marathon (26.2 miles), I participated in a 5K (3.1 miles). Now, this was just 8 months after learning how to walk again after my bilateral quadriceps tear. I knew that I would be the last one across the finish line... as I was only walking the route, not running... but I did it to show that I could. I completed the 5K in 83 minutes. Someday, I want to walk another 5K to get a better PR (that stands for Personal Record for you non-runners! ©)

I was feeling quite pleased with myself... that is, until I read the inspiring story of a man named Bob Wieland. Bob participated in the 1986 New York City Marathon, finishing as the 19,413<sup>th</sup> racer, finally completing the race in four days, two hours, 48 minutes, 17 seconds.

"Why so slow?" you might be asking. Bob may have been the slowest ever participant in this historic marathon, but he was also the first to run a marathon with his arms instead of his legs! Bob is a veteran whose legs were blown off in a Vietnam battlefield years ago. He recorded what race officials said was the slowest time in marathon history: but he was greeted like a champion by race director Fred Lebow, who had written Wieland off as a dropout. When he finished, Wieland shouted, "We love New York!" and repeatedly pumped his arms in the air. He claimed his finisher's medal and explained why he did it: "For the same

reason as 20,000 other people. It's the greatest marathon in the country."

He also cited three specific reasons to run:

- 1) to show his born-again Christian faith;
- 2) to test his conditioning; and
- 3) to promote the President's Council on Physical Fitness, of which he is a member. He said, "Success is not based on where you start; it's where you finish, and I finished. The first step was the most difficult; after that, we were on our way home. The joy has been the journey!" Wieland started Sunday at 8:23 am, more than two hours before the main body of runners. But, moving at an average speed of about one mile an hour, his lead soon vanished.



The champion, Gianni Poli, ran the entire race in the time it took Wieland to cross the Verrazano Bridge! Wieland runs in a sitting position, using his muscular arms like crutches to lift his torso and swing it forward. He sits on a 15 pound saddle and covers his clenched fists with pads he calls "size 1 running shoes."

The courage, faith, and integrity of this devout man of God are quite inspiring to me. As we run the race of faith, the victory is not seen in which of us run the fastest, but rather, that we finish strongly, with integrity, and giving God all glory, honor, and praise. We are not to be distracted by the lure of worldly sin, but we must remain focused on the gospel message of Jesus Christ. As a friend used to say all the time:

"the journey continues..."

# Board of TRUSTEES

The Trustees are embarking on an expensive project that, we hope, will prevent future breakdowns of the boiler motor. The electrical supply to this equipment is currently mounted on an outside basement wall which is under the back porch. There is an ongoing problem of water seeping under the porch and onto that wall and basement ceiling. While we are taking steps to alleviate the water issue too, it is a bit of guess-work and slow going. In the meantime, we simply can't risk having the boiler shutdown, because of dampness effecting the electrical components which operate its motors. So, *Gilroy Electric* has been hired to relocate all of these electrical boxes, conduit, sensors, and disconnects to an inside wall adjacent to other electrical components. This will put them away from any water or damp conditions. This project will cost \$14,576 to complete. Most of that is for replacing parts with new and water-resistant types that won't rust as the old material had done. Of course the hours of labor are not cheap either. We decided to fund this project with money from the United Methodist Foundation Trustees Accounts, which is the main source of funding for the Board expenses. Once completed, the Committee and congregation can rest assured that the boiler will operate as expected, during this coming winter.

We continue to wait for *Raimondo Restoration* to start work on the exterior church refinishing. They have been paid \$10,000 from the *Ross Fund*, for startup expenses. They are waiting for coordination with West Penn Power, to cover lines for worker safety, and they are also looking for the best weather to get this done.

Some repairs have been put on the back burner, since we believed the boiler electrical issues should be our number one concern. The restroom exhaust fan unit will have to wait until later this year or possibly into 2025. Upgrading sanctuary and hallway stage lights to LED will also be put off. Instead, we will attempt to continue with the usual replacement bulbs.


