#### SACRAMENT of HOLY COMMUNION

The Pastor shares an invitation to the Lord's Table...

The Lord be with you!

And also with you!

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them up to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.

We remember how Christ came from the vast expanses of heaven, to a world that barely made room for Him—fragile, vulnerable, and tiny. We shudder to think of a child in a backyard shed in the cold of the night, with only the protection that the intense love of His parents could give Him. We remember how shepherds and Magi knelt before Him... before He could form words of blessing, or raise His hand to heal. How they adored Him, not for what He had done, but rather, for who He was—God with us, a miracle to hold in your hands. We remember as well Christ in the upper room, as He gathered with His disciples, taking a loaf of bread and a cup of wine — as common as anything — and declared they also were a miracle —

a miracle to hold in our hands, because they would be signs of Your love for all eternity: bread for new life rising out of the old, and wine for forgiveness unearned yet complete. We remember with pain Christ's body defeated, and we remember with joy His rising from death, and we also remember with faithful hope as we await His return again.

Light of the world, we give thanks that You came among us, with healing in Your touch, with compassion in Your voice, and with grace in Your power.

Darkness may seem so strong, but the slightest light disrupts it.

Descend upon our world again, we pray; vanquish the powers of evil, sorrow, and despair. Shine for those who grieve tonight, those who are lost and lonely, those who are ill or empty, those who dread the night and fear the morning. Shine in us, that we might shine for them, that all the shadows would clear away and we would meet each other in heaven's glorious light, and call each other beloved as You do us.

Holy Spirit, rest Yourself in these gifts of bread and the vine, that they may be sure signs of Your love for us. Unite us with Christ—the holy Child of Bethlehem—that we might love as He loved so greatly... that this love may change the whole world.

This we pray in His precious name. Amen!
